What We Seek in a Contest Venue

One of the most common questions that the RMT fields is this: Why do we have our spring regional convention in Philadelphia, which is outside Region 15? Heck, I have been a member of Region 15 for almost 17 years now, and I have always competed in Philly.

The short answer is that the Philadelphia Sheraton, where we hold our convention, is the only facility that meets our minimum requirements for holding the contest AND that is priced relatively reasonably for Region 15 members.

Our Events Coordinator Carol Schultheis, the Regional Convention Committee and the Region 15 team are always on the hunt for alternatives. I can't list everything they have looked at in this story, but rest assured, they look at everything new that they hear about. Which brings me to the point of this article: Some of you have asked how you can help, so I asked Carol to share the minimum "specifications" of any facility that we might consider as the venue for future contests. Here are those requirements:

- One ballroom that is at least 15,000 square feet, with a ceiling that is minimum of 19-feet high
- One ballroom that is at least 7,000 square feet with a ceiling that is a minimum of 12-feet high
- 2 conference rooms that are at least 450 square feet
- 8 conference rooms that are a minimum of 700 square feet
- A minimum of 366 hotel rooms, a majority of them with two beds

If you step back and dwell on this a moment, it becomes quite clear that this is a tall order to fill. But we are willing to consider that the perfect Region 15 contest venue might indeed be in our future. Lisbet Kline First Recipient of the Harriette Walters Leadership Award By Dana Dunlevy



Lisbet Kline was named the first recipient of The Harriette Walters Leadership Award at the March 2011 Region 15 contest. The award was introduced at the 2010 Region 15 contest to recognize members who demonstrate the leadership qualities of enthusiasm, confidence, passion and commitment to excellence, exemplified by International Faculty and Master Director Harriette Walters. Lisbet was chosen by the Regional Management Team from a slate of nominees who were submitted from members around the Region.

Lisbet started her Sweet Adelines career in 1975. She founded and directed the second SAI chapter in Stockholm, Sweden (the current Stockholm City Voices), chartered in 1979. She was appointed to the Regional Music Faculty

and founded another chorus, now the Baltic Harmony Chorus, before moving to California in 1985.

As a member of Region 11, Lisbet joined South Towns Chorus and became active in the chapter leadership. While still singing with South Towns, she became Music Director of Golden Sands Chorus. The chorus went from 'worst to first' under her guidance, qualifying for the Small Chorus International Harmony Classic contest in 2002. From 1994-2003 she served on the Region 11 Regional Board of Directors.

Since moving to Pennsylvania in 2002, she became Director of Song of the Valley Chorus in 2005, was appointed to the newly-created Regional Membership Coordinator position in 2006, and currently serves as the Regional Education Coordinator.

Lisbet has also served our organization on the International level. Among her many accomplishments there, she served on the Sweet Adelines International Board of Trustees for the Young Singers Foundation from 1996-2003.

The nominations for Lisbet came from many members from around the Region–members of Song of the Valley Chorus, members who have worked directly with her on a committee, members who have simply met her when she visited their chorus. Many had their own personal stories to share about Lisbet, but the same themes kept showing up in each of them–loving, teacher, enthusiastic, inspirational, encouraging, positive, team-player, leads by example. Some quotations:

Is The Art Of Designing Jeans In Your Genes? by Loretta Peskin

As members of Sweet Adelines International, we strive to achieve visual success in our performances. Each chorus is required to present a unified appearance, a look which has been painstakingly created to blend perfectly with the music.

At Regional Competition in March 2011, there was a variety of attractive outfits that came across the stage. The splendor of color and sparkle intermingled with the music. The outcome was a delightful experience. (A sampling of these looks appears on pages 24-25)

Who chooses those garments? No one person can create a vision for us all. Costuming is a team effort. Just ask any one of the ten costume committee members from Hickory Tree Chorus. For the past year they have been in search of a facelift in the form of a new costume.

Together with chorus members they have surrounded themselves with more than 50 swatches of fabric, pored over countless catalogs and sported sample designs in order to find that new and perfect "look." Rita Peyton, Costume Chairwoman, has their final answer under wraps, "Look for us in our new 'duds' on stage at the Harmony Classic this October 2011."

Blaise from Greater Nassau Chorus (GNC) said, "Adaptability in costuming is a consideration, as we often must add pieces and accessories to portray a character or develop a storyline." The bridal veils and bouquets used in singing the first package in Nashville, allowed GNC to express individuality and were visually pleasing. As the O'Hara sisters in the second package, GNC added "the drapery." No two were exactly alike, but the use of similar colors, shapes and textures maintained a unit look.

The Evergreen Chorus is facing an ever-growing challenge. How do you keep a 14-year-old member in pants that aren't progressively getting shorter?

Has your costume designer ever been inspired by a dress Off the Rack? Stephanie Ofshinsky of Harmony Celebration Chorus (HCC) has. As the granddaughter of an expert seamstress it is clear that sewing is in her blood. Her vision for the black and silver costume came together just weeks before the 2010 International Competition. Penny Teece's home became a sweatshop as the two women along with their crew worked feverishly in the weeks leading up to Seattle.

Sometimes one costume isn't enough. HCC sported their Barbie characters courtesy of creators Jean Schoenlank and Diane Sussuma at regional competition for all to enjoy. With so many different costumes it was like Barbie's Dream house all over again. (Have a look at page 26)

The good news is that I am recovering at a rapid pace and headed back to rehearsals, teaching and coaching in April. Before I had my stroke I was feeling the best I had been in a long time, so the good news, is that it was <u>not</u> my heart, but possibly something hereditary that can be treated. The bad news is that 700,000 people have strokes every year and the majority are in their 40's to 50's. So again this is my opportunity to reach out to all my sisters in harmony to remind you to take good care of your health. Sadly, heart attacks and strokes are still the leading cause of death in women.

I would also like to thank Deb Poulson, my associate director, who helped to prepare my chorus, along with Jack Pinto, who was generous enough to donate his time, the four weeks prior to contest, and direct the chorus to be ready for this contest. I also have an amazing administrative and music staff who have been of great support to me and to the members of the Liberty Oak Chorus.

I am truly blessed to be a part of such a great community of talent and so many people I can call my friends. The cards and prayers really made a difference. I am looking forward to seeing all of you soon. Congratulations to Harmony Celebration Chorus and a.k.a., both are great champions. And to everyone who competed this year, you are all winners for going on that stage!
