It has been my pleasure to serve the Greater New York Region 15 in the capacity of Education Coordinator. This May will mark the start of my sixth and final year on the Regional Management Team.

One of my goals as Education Coordinator was to increase membership participation at TRAX and at other educational events. YOU have helped me reach that goal! Apart from choosing and contracting years ahead with the best faculty, the big challenge is finding affordable locations. The choice for venue location is made using the following criteria:

- Affordable hotel rooms
- Enough break-out rooms for a reasonable price
- Audio-visual equipment for the best price
- Best hotel food and prices

New Jersey is by far the most affordable place, and the hotels chosen have wanted our business. They were willing to negotiate with the Events Coordinator, Carol Schultheis, who has done a remarkable job of combining all of those demands into one hotel. Carol has managed to maintain the price at the Sheraton Parsippany for several years in a row, while other hotel prices have skyrocketed.

Unfortunately, hotels in New York (Westchester and Long Island) are much more expensive, although we continue to evaluate them regularly. We regret that many of you have to drive hours, however, I want to remind you of the following: We are one of very few regions where members CAN drive under four hours to get to any event. An example: Region 13 consists of Alaska, Montana, Idaho and Washington. I have chosen to be thankful we are so close that we can all drive, not fly, to our events. I thank you for understanding our ongoing dilemma and for attending our education events in record numbers.

- 2. A new place where prospective quartet-ers can submit an interest form. Another new feature on the Web site can be found in the section: "Are You in Search of a Quartet?" If you are hoping to find a quartet situation, click on the "Sign up for listing" link. There, you can fill out a form describing the sort of quartet you are seeking. This information will be displayed publicly in the "Quartet Resources" section on the home page. You can see who else is looking by clicking on this link.

I'm not sure many of you realize the services and hosting for the Region 15 Web site are donated to the region. Her chorus, *Heart of Long Island*, is a small group comprised of 23 enthusiastic members, who practice on Tuesdays in Holtsville, New York. They have been in existence for 50 years, but she has found her way into their hearts in just a few short months.

"She certainly did find her way into the *Hearts of Long Island*", says member Ginny Pawluki. "Leona's personality is contagious."

Penny Frauhammer, another member of the team who hired her, remarked: "We chose Leona because of her superior directorial skills and above all her unfailing sense of humor."

Added Katina Nineve: "We needed no convincing when we met Leona the first day she came to the *Heart of Long Island* chorus. Leona has shared her musical talent, humor, knowledge, enthusiasm and love for the art of barbershop. Her commitment to the *Heart of Long Island* is contagious."

One recent Friday night, Leona and I spent some time reflecting on the path she has taken in achieving this milestone. By the end of our two-hour conversation, she had unraveled some of the musical mysteries in her life's journey.

As a child, Leona's interest in music was nurtured by her mother, a classically trained pianist and teacher. "Music has filled my life, all of my life, because of her influence," she says.

She fondly recalled learning how to sing with her mom. Although Leona studied both classical and pop voice, she connected most with show music. She added guitar, because it was a "portable instrument," and ultimately she began performing folk programs for audiences while still in her teens.

Interestingly, Leona considers herself a dancer first! As a young girl she studied in New York City with Blanche Evan, a contemporary of Martha Graham, an American dance choreographer regarded as the pioneer and leader of modern dance. For 12 years, Leona was exposed to all of the splendors of ballet, choreography and modern dance. However, it was singing that won out.

While tending to the necessities of motherhood, Leona continued singing with a variety of choruses. Eventually she discovered *Island Hills*. She was hooked! Dave Johnson was the director at the time. He was a good teacher and mentor and readily shared his enthusiasm for barbershop harmony. It was at his suggestion that she became an assistant director.

Leona has been singing with *Island Hills Chorus* for almost 13 years, and with the *Long Island Philharmonic Chorus* for three seasons. *Heart of Long Island* is fortunate to have Leona leading them as they discover the joys of beautiful harmony and music.
