

PURPOSE of SAT




- Learn about the music you are singing
- Determine admissibility for Sweet
 Adelines performance
- Evaluate your songs to best serve performers and audience.

WHICH SONGS?



- All songs in your repertoire
- Start with competition songs
- When choosing new music, do a song assessment first
- Check database first!

SAT PROCESS





- Song Title
- Who is the arranger?
- What is the style of this song?
- What year was this song written?
- Who wrote the lyrics?
- What did your research tell you about the lyricist?
- What other material has been written by this lyricist?
- Who is the composer of this song?
- What did your research tell you about the composer?
- What other material has been written by this composer?



- Write out the lyrics and read them like poetry or a story.
- Who and what is this song about, as originally intended by the composer and earlier performers?
- Did this song, originally or subsequently, demean a marginalized group (a group considered at a social disadvantage) through idiomatic expressions, metaphors, or jargon?
- What historical or social events were happening at the time this song was written?
- Look up the original sheet music to this song. Does any illustration or other characteristic of the sheet music reflect an inappropriate theme?



- Does the research on the background of the song reveal any discriminatory, racist, or non-inclusive prior versions?
- Could the message of the song, original or subsequent, limit any singer or audience member's ability to engage because it reflects a particular religious point of view?
- Could the message of the song, original or subsequent, exclude or demean any singer or audience member related to the following:
 - Gender
 - Sexual Orientation
 - · Multicultural/Racial Background
 - Age
 - Disability
 - Socioeconomic Status
- Are there any other marginalized groups that you considered in regards to whether the song would exclude or demean them?




 Are there any adjustments to the lyric that would make it more inclusive or current to our chorus culture or societal norms?

Write any suggested lyrics changes.

 If you had suggested lyric changes, consider the following: Would any performer or audience member likely be aware of the original lyrics and message, even with the suggested lyric changes?

 Does your chorus/quartet believe that this song has a racist/discriminatory/non-inclusive background, lyrics, composer, etc.?



PARODY LYRICS



Parody lyrics need to be submitted for evaluation even if the original song has been deemed admissible.
