Tom's introduction to barbershop harmony was in his all-boys high school in Evanston, Illinois. His glee club teacher encouraged him to sing in a quartet as an extracurricular activity. They enjoyed singing and even performed for the local all-girls high schools. In college he formed a quartet which won second place in a talent show.

But the "aha" moment came when Tom borrowed the LP of The Confederates Quartet, the 1956 SPEBSQSA Champions. He fell in love with the harmony and learned all the parts of all the songs on the record. He discovered SPEBSQSA and became a member, singing tenor in a quartet with his father and brother. They won an Illinois District Novice Quartet contest. Soon he was singing baritone in the Gold Coast Four Quartet, which became the Illinois District Champions in 1964.

Within a year after moving to NY in 1965, he was directing both a men's and a women's chorus. At various times since, he has been director of North Queens Men's Chorus, Flushing Meadows Sweet Adelines Chorus, the Hambletonian Chorus (Men's), and an assistant director of the Westchester Golden Chordsmen, where he sang in the Conchords Quartet.

Tom met his wife, June, in 1966 when she attended a guest night at Flushing Meadows Chorus. He proposed at a Sweet Adelines Music School in Philadelphia in February, 1967.
