Sweet Adelines - Beginnings...

- The first Sweet Adelines Convention was in Tulsa in 1947 including a competition including 12 quartets. At the convention a National Board of Directors was elected and voted all chapters would pay a \$5 chartering fee and .50 per member fee. 18 chapters chartered in the first year.
- The first Regional competition was in 1951 In West Bend, Wisconsin with 7 Wisconsin chapters competing.
- The organization becomes International when the first chorus charters outside of the USA in Brandon, Manitoba, Canada in 1953.
- In 1973, the first International Chorus Competition is held in Washington, DC, where more that 4,000 Sweet Adelines gather. This is more than twice the number registered for any previous convention.
