Congratulations to Our Regional Champions Greater Nassau Chorus and Escape Quartet

Our dedicated and hardworking Sweet Adelines members of Region 15 enjoyed a competition weekend filled with fun, friendship and harmony. Congratulations to all participants!

The Greater Nassau Chorus placed first with an overall score of 695 points, the highest our region has ever received. This award-winning chorus, which finished fourth at the 2009 International Competition in Nashville, will represent Region 15 once again at the Sweet Adelines International Competition to be held in Houston, Texas, in October 2011.

Escape Quartet took top honors in the Region 15 2010 quartet competition with a score of 582. The foursome will represent Region 15 as our quartet champions in Seattle, Washington, in October 2010.

Hickory Tree Chorus captured the First Place Midsize Chorus honor and finished 2nd place overall with a score of 632 points.

Jersey Harmony received the honor of First Place Small Chorus for the second year in a row.

Island Hills Chorus was recognized with the Most Improved Chorus award for its score of 518 points, an improvement of 57 points. The Novice Quartet award went to The Four Baris, which was 4th place overall in the quartet competition with a score of 531 points.

Forty percent of our reporting chapters, offering free vocal lessons, accounted for eighty one (81) percent of our new members in the third quarter. After a fabulously run competition, it is with great joy that I can announce the continued improvement of our choruses and quartets.

The top six (6) most improved choruses had improvements in the double digits. (57, 40, 40, 32, 26, 25 & 10) The most improved quartet increased 78 points since last year. More results are listed on the <u>Region 15 web site</u> for your enjoyment. Congratulations to all of you!

We now have four (4) choruses in the 600 point range, *Greater Nassau* is knocking on the 700point range with their 695 in April, *Harmony Celebration* with their 2009 score of 662, getting ready for Seattle, *Liberty Oak* with their 2009 score of 640, also getting ready for Seattle, and *Hickory Tree with* this year's score of 632.

Hickory Tree has a chance to become an international competitor for 2011. The top five (5) scoring small and medium sized choruses in the Sweet Adelines International Organization will be invited to Houston to compete in the *Harmony Classic Competition* on Tuesday, just prior to the rest of the International Competition!

Furthermore, two (2) of our choruses are in the 500 range, six (6) in the 400 range, and everyone else is moving up and out of the 300 range – absolutely wonderful!

We are sending two quartets to Seattle; our new 2010 Regional Quartet Champions *Escape* and our 2009 Regional Quartet Champions *a.k.a* (who qualified automatically by placing 11th at International Competition last year). To those of you who scored below your capability, please choose to look at your performances as learning experiences and remain positive.

So why is our region doing so well? Because *you*, the members, have chosen to attend the Educational Seminars in higher numbers than ever before. Education is the key for both directors and members to improve; and what is more fun than singing better? As your Educational Director, I am required to plan our faculty three to five (3-5) years ahead, and right now we have dates and faculty contracted through 2013. Contacts have been made with potential faculty for 2014 and 2015. As soon as they are confirmed, those dates and faculty names will be listed on the regional website.

Speaking of which, I hope you will choose to take a moment to put those dates onto your calendar. Missing a fabulous educational event is sad when you or your leadership forgets to write those dates on the chorus calendar and instead plans performances, retreats, etc., that conflict with the regional events and thus prevent *you*, the member, from participating.

Region 15 has been able to bring in top-notch faculty who have helped us progress. Thank you for continuing support and attendance.

TRAX is coming up soon – packages are almost ready and will go out at the end of May. I ask that you choose to sign up before going on vacation so you won't miss the deadline for the incredible chance of being coached by Jim and Renee this August. We are trying to ensure that you will get that chance. The A & B choruses will be involved, as well as other demo choruses. Information will be forthcoming. It is just around the corner.

You may have noticed that I used the word choose throughout the article. It is amazing to me how much more we can achieve personally and as a team in our choruses if we make different choices. We can choose to rehearse at home during the week or not. We can choose to write all regional dates down when we get them so we can plan around them or not. We can choose to go to rehearsal and leave fatigue and problems behind us or not. A Director can choose his/her intention for the rehearsal and go in with the decision to create an upbeat, positive, fun atmosphere that promotes friendship and learning or not. The choices we make affect the Sweet Adelines experiences and make them better or worse. What is your choice?

I choose to look forward and to see record numbers of participants at the Music/Leadership weekend with Kathy Carmody. I choose to believe you all are as excited as I am for the upcoming August 13th-15th TRAX event featuring Jim Arns and Renee Porzel.

Ability to identify great ideas: If there is more than one solution to a challenge, this person will make sure all angles are considered. She should be a catalyst for creativity and ideas from her team, chapter or committee.

Willingness to motivate and inspire: A great leader knows her weaknesses and collaborates with others to build on everyone's strengths. She knows how to delegate AND how to assemble a great team.

Dedication to ongoing growth: A great leader strives toward high standards and continually raises the bar for excellence.

If you know someone who possesses these qualities and who has made a noteworthy contribution to Region 15, we strongly encourage you to nominate her for this award. Eligible for this award is any Region 15 member in good standing whom you believe possesses these qualities. Your nomination should include a listing of the individual's past and current contributions to the Sweet Adelines organization, along with a short essay of no more than 250 words describing why you think this individual deserves recognition. This is a one-time award: Past recipients are not eligible for nomination. However, you may re-submit qualified candidates as often as you'd like. You are also welcome to suggest more than one candidate.

Please submit your nomination by December 15, 2010, to the Regional Team Coordinator, Arlene Gunther. A description of the award and these criteria may be downloaded from the Region 15 Web site at this link.

Award selections will be made during the annual retreat of the Region 15 Regional Management Team and it will be presented during the spring 2011 contest.
